

Statement on the use of conflict materials

Dear Customers,

in 2010, the US Congress passed the “Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, Section 1502” (“Dodd-Frank Act” for short). Based on this, Regulation (EU) 2017/821 of European Parliament and Council adopted on 17 May 2017. Both are intended to help control the trade in minerals from conflict areas so that natural mineral resources in conflict or high-risk areas do not give rise to controversy and their yields encourage the outbreak or continuation of violent conflicts.

We can confirm to you that we know how to fulfill the duty of care as a producer and importer of end products and that these provisions can prompt our direct and indirect customers to take action within their worldwide to carry out the supply chain.

Allied Vision Finning GmbH itself does not import conflict minerals (Tin, tantalum, tungsten and gold; also known as "3TG") nor their derivatives of tin stone, columbite-tantalite and wolframite directly from metal works or other sources in conflict and high-risk areas. Nevertheless, all four mentioned minerals are common in the manufacture of electronic components worldwide and can also be found in the electronic components we provide to customers.

Out of responsibility, we work in our procurement management according to the guidelines of our "Code of Supply" and the guiding principles of our "Code of Conduct" and rely exclusively on well-known manufacturers and long-term distributors, but we have no direct influence on the origin of the ones used Minerals. Within the scope of our possibilities and in cooperation with our suppliers, we continue to work on creating the necessary transparency that allows us to provide our customers with reliable information and thus in to assist in the fulfillment of their possible burden of proof in an appropriate manner.

At this point in time, we have no references to existing materials from conflict and high-risk areas that are not considered "conflict-free". The statements are based on data that manufacturers and suppliers have made available to us.

We hope we were able to satisfy you with our statement on the subject of conflict material.
